Dear Councilman Joe Buscaino:

The Northwest San Pedro Neighborhood Council supports the principle of a 1/8th mile strip suitable for car racing purposes.

The Brotherhood of Street Racers, Inc. is seeking a location, either permanent or temporary, to allow racing under safe, off-street conditions. The Brotherhood has a history, through its founder and membership, of encouraging and enhancing "street peace" through its outreach to and acceptance of a diverse community of race enthusiasts.

It is obvious that an organized off-street environment is far superior to illegal and sometimes deadly street racing, which is occurring in our community in the dead of night.

We understand that elements of both the LAPD and the Sheriff's department support the concept of a safe location for this activity.

We urge the Brotherhood, working with all interested parties and with your office, as well as law enforcement, to seek property in the Harbor area, including but not limited to, Port of LA and Port of Long Beach property for at least temporary space.
