Purpose and Intent:

The Grant Writing Committee at President Avenue Elementary school has been successful at bringing new programs to our school. These programs include the Arts Program, music, drama, dance, and visual arts, Writing Workshop Program from Columbia University, Boys and Girls Club Program, Afterschool Services(YDP)and the Wonder of Reading Library volunteer reading program, in accordance with the support of teachers, students, and staff at President Avenue Elementary. It is our goal to renovate our main literacy garden by replacing our patio furniture to represent our dedication to these programs. Public Purpose and Benefit:

Volunteers will be engaged in the following activities: renew planters by pulling out weeds, planting new vegetation, removing unnecessary furniture and assembling the new patio tables. At the completion of this project we will be inviting members of the community to a ribbon cutting ceremony. We will recognize the grant writers and the Harbor City Neighborhood Council. The ceremony will include staff, students, parents, and volunteers. We will also invite key members of the community and elected officials who have supported our Wonder of Reading Library and encouraged us to maintain and enhance our Literacy Gardens over the years.

We have utilized this Literacy Garden for multiple purposes including author visits, animators and the like. The mother of the author of the book "The Jester that lost his Jingle" has visited President Avenue before to help us with our Read-A Thons. What a wonderful place to enjoy reading experiences at school. During Dr. Seuss birthday month we conduct events with community members, not only parents and grandparents, but the local Fire and Police Departments have been volunteering time to read in the garden with students of all ages. Upper elementary students read to lower grade children and literacy abounds.

This location is an area of significance because it is a major focal point for our "Wizard of Oz" mural. The Emerald City has been designed to instill the love of reading being that the buildings are genres of books(i.e.: Fairy Tales, Adventure, Fiction, Non-Fiction, Mystery etc.) Here is a place that we gather to share knowledge and learn how to dream. Henceforth, we will be able to host various community gatherings to include not only the Harbor City Neighborhood Council, but the Narbonne Hart's Academy, Chamber of Commerce and invite other schools to participate in workshops and presentations in a beautiful serene atmosphere to promote positive thinking and extraordinary outcomes.


